**COLD CASE HOMICIDE: GLENN GREENING**

Glenn Greening was born on April 20, 1920 in American Fork, Utah. Glenn Greening enlisted in the United States Air Force in 1939. During World War II, Greening flew on 86 combat missions in the South Pacific, earning 24 awards that include four bronze stars. Greening retired from the Air Force in 1967 with the rank of Senior Master Sergeant.

At the time of his death, Greening was married with one daughter. Greening was employed in sales and arrived in the Denver metro area on business on February 23, 1981. On this date, Greening checked into the Landmark Hotel, located at 455 S. Colorado Blvd.

On the night of February 24, 1981, Greening met two friends at the bar in the Landmark Hotel for drinks until approximately 5:30 PM. The group then broke up, agreeing to meet back in the bar later that evening.

Greening dined alone from approximately 7:00 PM– 7:45 PM at the Colorado Mine Company– located then in the 4400 Blk of E. Virginia Ave. Greening met back up with his friends in the Landmark Hotel bar at approximately 8:00 PM that night.

At approximately 9:30 PM, Greening and his friends went to the Rodeo Lounge, located then in the 400 Blk. of S. Colorado Blvd. A few minutes after arriving, Greening left the Rodeo Lounge.

Greening's body was discovered in the parking lot near the Rodeo Lounge at approximately 11:25 PM that night. Greening had been shot during an apparent robbery.

The Glendale Police Department has recently reviewed this case and is looking for any information in regard to this crime.
